Materials:

- Worsted weight yarn (100 grams)
- Size 4 (3.5 mm) straight knitting needles

- 1. Cast on 30 stitches.
- 2. Knit every row until the piece measures 4 inches from the cast-on edge.

- 6. Fold the bottom edge of the bootie up by 1 inch and sew it down.
- 7. Fold the top edge of the bootie down by 1 inch and sew it down.
- 8. Sew a button to the front of the bootie.

Intermediate Baby Booties Patterns

3. Pretty Lace-Up Baby Booties

These booties are a bit more advanced than the beginner patterns, but they're still suitable for intermediate knitters. The lace pattern adds a touch of elegance, while the ribbon ties make it easy to adjust the fit.

Materials:

- Lace weight yarn (100 grams)
- Size 2 (2.75 mm) straight knitting needles

Instructions:

- 1. Cast on 60 stitches.
- 2. Knit 1 row.
- 3. Lace Row: *K2, YO, K2, YO, K2, YO, K2, YO, K2*. Repeat from * to * until the end of the row.
- 4. Repeat Rows 2 and 3 for 2 inches.
- 5. Switch to stockinette stitch (knit every row) for 2 inches.
- 6. Bind off all stitches.
- 7. Fold the piece in half lengthwise, with the right sides together, and sew the sides together.
- 8. Fold the bottom edge of the bootie up by 1 inch and sew it down.
- 9. Fold the top edge of the bootie down by 1 inch and sew it down.
- 10. Thread a ribbon through the holes at the top of the bootie and tie it in a bow.

4. Adorable Bunny Ear Baby Booties

These booties are perfect for Easter or any other occasion where you want to dress up your baby in an adorable outfit. The bunny face and floppy ears are sure to bring a smile to anyone's face.

Materials:

Worsted weight yarn in two colors (50 grams each)

Size 4 (3.5 mm) straight knitting needles

Instructions:

- 1. Cast on 30 stitches in the main color.
- 2. Knit every row until the piece measures 4 inches from the cast-on edge.
- 3. Bind off all stitches.
- 4. Repeat Steps 1-3 in the second color.
- 5. Fold each piece in half lengthwise, with the right sides together, and sew the sides together.
- 6. Fold the bottom edge of each piece up by 1 inch and sew it down.
- 7. Fold the top edge of each piece down by 1 inch and sew it down.
- 8. Sew the two pieces



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
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
