
Conspiracy Theories: 238 Passengers and the Bomb Train





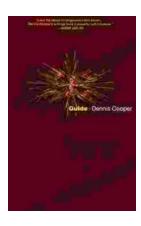
