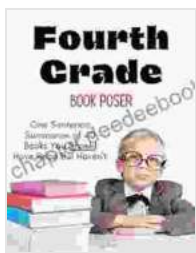


One Sentence Summaries of 40 Books You Should Have Read But Haven't

A passionate and destructive love affair between two people from different social classes.



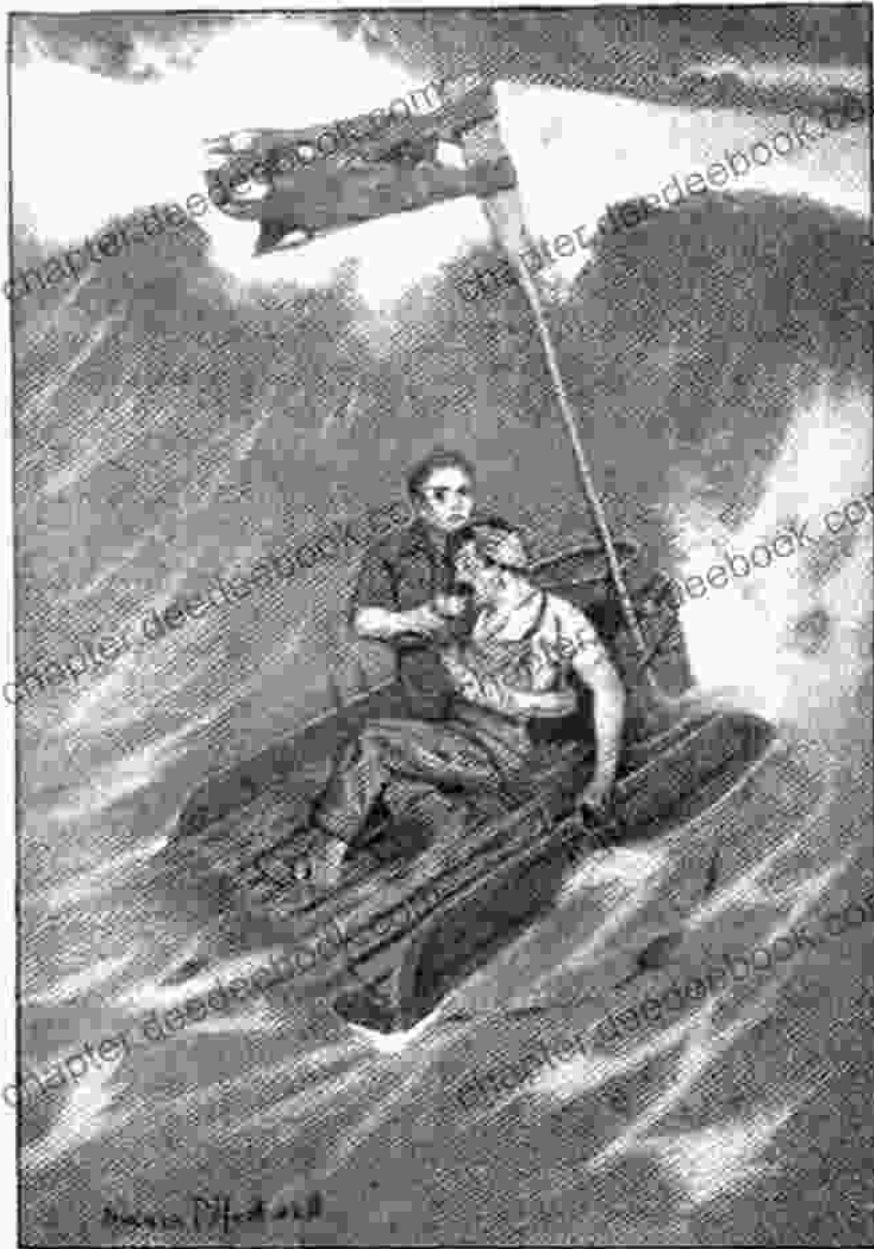
8. The Catcher in the Rye by J.D. Salinger

An epic poem about the Trojan War.



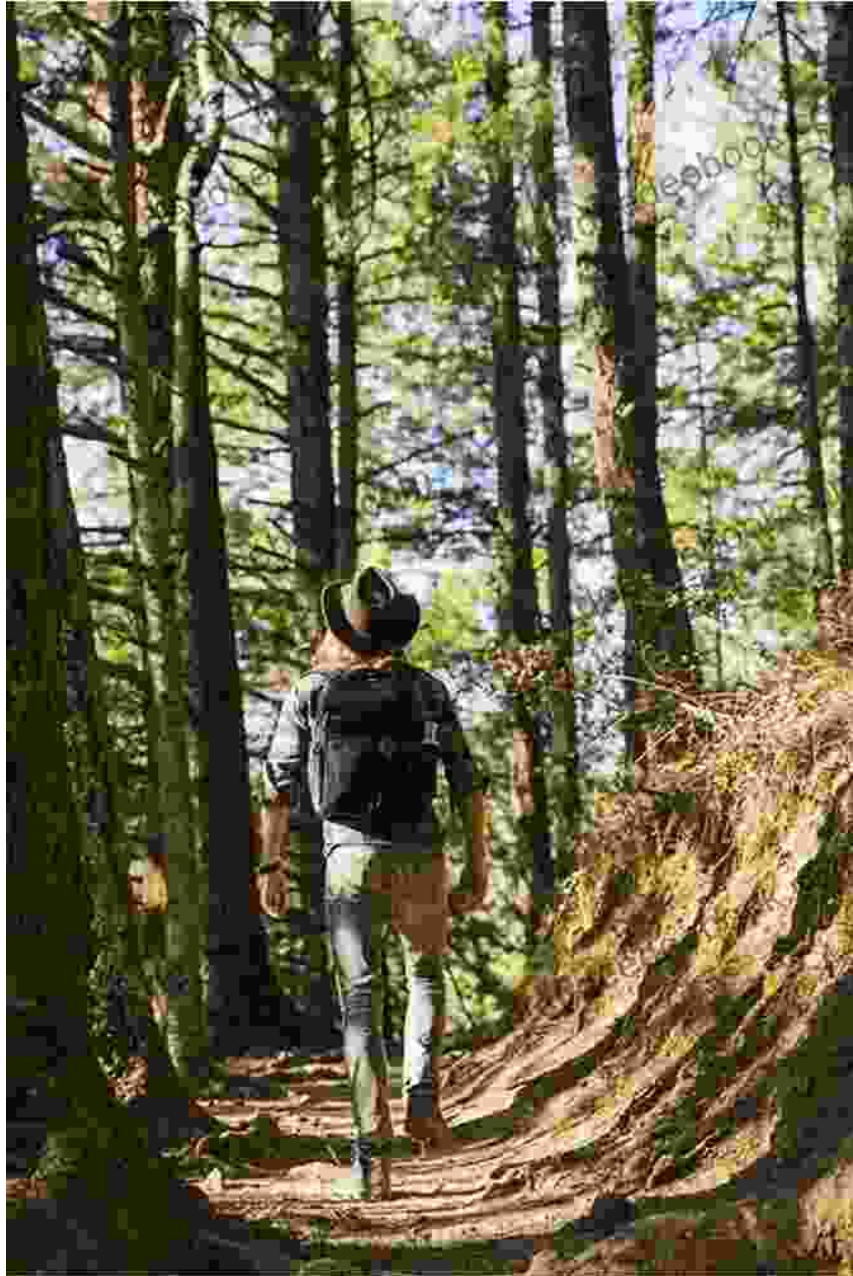
11. The Odyssey by Homer

A young girl steals books and shares them with others in Nazi Germany.



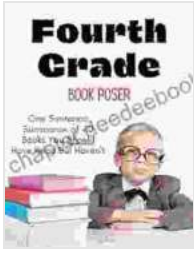
16. Life of Pi by Yann Martel
