Instructions:


1. Bring the needle up through the fabric at point A.
2. Insert the needle back into the fabric at point B, about 1/4 inch away from point A.
3. Bring the needle back up through the fabric at point C, about 1/4 inch away from point B.
4. Continue stitching in this manner until you reach the end of your desired line.

7. Bring the needle back up through the fabric at point G, about 1/4 inch away from point F.
8. Continue stitching in this manner until you reach the end of your desired line.


1. Bring the needle up through the fabric at point A.
2. Insert the needle back into the fabric at point B, about 1/16 inch away from point A.
3. Bring the needle back up through the fabric at point C, about 1/16 inch away from point B.
4. Continue stitching in this manner until you reach the end of your desired shape.
5. To fill in an area, start at one edge of the area and stitch in rows, working your way from one edge to the other.

Instructions:

1. Bring the needle up through the fabric at point A.
2. Wrap the thread around the needle twice.
3. Insert the needle back into the fabric at point B, about 1/16 inch away from point A.
4. Bring the needle back up through the fabric at point C, about 1/16 inch away from point B.
5. Pull the thread through to create a knot.

6. Trim the excess thread.

These are just a few of the many hand embroidery stitches that you can learn. With a little practice, you'll be able to master these stitches and create beautiful works of art.




