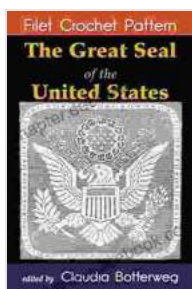

Historical Context

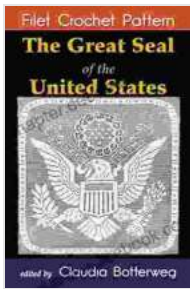
